# National University of Singapore (NUS)



Founded in 1905, the National University of Singapore (NUS) is a premier institution of higher learning in Asia. Long known for its high academic standards, NUS has consistently invested in, among other things, the recruitment and development of renowned academic staff, value added degree programs and state-of-the-art facilities.

The roots of NUS can be traced back to Singapore's first center of higher education, the Straits Settlements and Federated Malay States Government Medical School, which was founded in 1905. The School gained recognition and rose in status to become the King Edward VII College of Medicine in 1928.

Raffles College was established to offer tertiary level courses in Arts and Science. In 1949, it combined with the Medical College to form a full-fledged university, the University of Malaya. In 1962, each of the two branches of the University of Malaya became autonomous national institutions, and the University of Singapore was born. In 1980, the University of Singapore and Nanyang University merged to form the National University of Singapore.

NUS' MBA program has been ranked among the top ten MBA programs in Asia-Pacific by *Asia Inc.* since 1999. It is the first choice in Singapore for young and dynamic leaders of industry and government.
