The Vienna Economics & Business University (WU Wien), was founded in 1898 and is Austria's largest and best known university specializing in economics and business. Research is an important component of WU Wien's academic mission. The university emphasizes a wide range of fields such as computer networks, high-tech marketing, cross-cultural management, and managing business in Eastern & Central Europe.

Students attending WU Wien enroll in one of four fields of study: (1) Business Administration, (2) Commerce,



(3) Economics and (4) Business Education. The first two years of the four-year program provide basic training in business, corporate law, mathematics & statistics, languages, sociology, and economics. During the third (ideal for TAMU undergraduates) and fourth (ideal for TAMU masters students) years students could concentrate on selected fields of specialization (twenty areas of specialization ranging from Tourism to International Business). Eligible MBA/MS students from Texas A&M University can take courses offered in the fourth year (and/or some third year) courses of WU Wien. You must register for a minimum of 9 credit hours of course work each semester at TAMU while you are enrolled at WU Wien. Program details:

(adequate number of courses is offered in English so TAMU students will not require proficiency in German)

Program (semester) dates: Fall (mid September – January 31); Spring (mid February – end June)
