Elective courses can be taken in Accounting, Finance, Human Resources, Marketing, Management, MIS, Operations, and International Business.

Fluency in German is not required since an adequate number of courses are offered in English. Courses in general Business Administration that integrate all aspects of management are also available. These courses are similar to business policy or strategy courses offered at Texas A&M University.

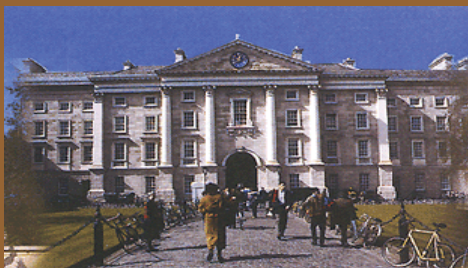
