Université de Caen Basse Normandie was founded in 1432 by King Henry VI of England and by 1438 already had five colleges. The university was integrated with France by the King of France, Charles VII. On July 7, 1944, the university was totally destroyed by aerial bombing. Reconstruction began in 1948 and the new university was inaugurated in June 1957. The campus is centrally located in the city and has approximately 16,000 students. The university logo, the mythical bird, the Phoenix symbolises this revival.



Caen provides an ideal location for students interested in learning more about France, its language, and its people. In the 11th Century, William the Conqueror chose Caen as an official residence and directed the construction of several important monuments that still stand today. The city suffered greatly during the final phases of World War II, but it has been rebuilt and is now a modern, thriving city of 200,000 inhabitants. Excellent museums and a municipal theater contribute to its rich cultural life.
