



Universite de Lausanne (UNIL)

Dorigny, Switzerland



The 'Universite de Lausanne, a 91-hectare campus, is located in Dorigny on the shores of Lake Geneva. Founded in 1537, the Lausanne Academy gained its status as a university in 1980. Today UNIL is one of Switzerland's major institutions of higher education. It is comprised of seven colleges: Economics and Business Administration (HEC), Humanities, Law, Science and Medicine, Social and Political Sciences (SSP), and Theology. In addition, there are a number of associated institutes, such as: the Jean Monnet



Foundation for Europe and the Center for European Research; the International Institute for Management Development (IMD); and the Center for Business Law (CEDIDAC).

Dating from the foundation of the Academy in 1537, the University of Lausanne, together with the Federal Polytechnic of Lausanne, now forms a vast campus devoted to teaching and research, whose influence extends far beyond the frontiers of Switzerland. The University of Lausanne is spread over three sites, the biggest of which is at Dorigny on the shores of Lake Lemman.

Undergraduate business majors from Texas A&M University, usually at the junior level, will be permitted to take courses during UNIL's semesters (mid October through March and early March through early July). You must register for 12 credit hours of course work each semester at TAMU while you are enrolled at HEC - Lausanne. You must be fluent in French to be able to attend classes and take full advantage of HEC's academic program and cultural experience.
