Tokyo Keizai University (TKU), founded in 1900, is one of the oldest universities specializing in economics-related studies in Japan. The main campus is located in the residential and educational area of Kokubunji, some thirty kilometers west of central Tokyo. TKU offers undergraduate and graduate classes in Economics and Business Administration and has a total enrollment of about 1,500 students.

Tokyo Keizai University has taken a bold new step forward. As the university continues to build upon their 96-year



history, they developed a solid foundation with the twin Faculties of Economics and Business Administration, and their Junior College. In 1995, the first Faculty of Communication Studies in Japan was founded. Finally, in March of 1995, they completed renovations of the facilities and grounds of the school, as well as the construction of a new, fully-modernized classroom building on the main campus. These improvements in their educational content and facilities, combined with their outstanding campus location near the new heart of Tokyo, promise a bright future for the university.

You may enroll for course work in either the second or third year of TKU's program. Since almost all courses are taught in Japanese, you will need fluency in that language to attend classes and take full advantage of TKU's academic and cultural experience. This is a non-reciprocal exchange program.
